





One "hot topic" was how the **annual dues** will affect the individual clubs. Here's what we learned.

- 1. All clubs owe semi-annual dues now, amount was determined by the roster sent previously.
- 2. Club annual billing, beginning in September, will be based on charter month. The procedure will be similar to what we have now in that Kiwanis International will send each club its roster. The club secretary/treasurer should update the roster, adding new members and deleting former members. The number of members on the updated roster will determine the club's obligation to Kiwanis International. The schedule is at the right.
